### Math Institute

The Center on Instruction's Mathematics Strand hosted a Mathematics Institute on *Content Knowledge for Elementary School Teachers* on January 26-27, 2007, in Berkeley, California, which discussed the importance of teachers' content knowledge in making pedagogical decisions to improve student achievement. The highlight of the conference was demonstrations of conceptual foundations of mathematical content by Professor Wu of the University of California at Berkeley.

Conference presenters also discussed implications for professional development activities for teachers including practical suggestions for improving teachers' mathematical content knowledge and strategies for developing students' conceptual understanding. The conference also focused on creating mechanisms for integrating deep understanding of mathematics knowledge into professional development activities.

# **Upcoming Events**

### **Adolescent Literacy Resource**

The Center on Instruction's Reading Strand is publishing a major guidance document on adolescent literacy, scheduled for release in late March. This approximately 190-page document is titled *Academic Literacy Instruction for Adolescents*.

It will include recommendations for improvements to literacyrelated instruction in the content areas or across the entire school day, interventions for students reading below grade level, and recommendations for supporting literacy development in adolescent English language learners.

Also included are comments from experts in response to questions about methods for improving academic literacy in adolescents and examples of state activities in support of improved adolescent literacy in California, Florida, Rhode Island, and Washington.
