History of RTI

- California Department of Education has had successful statewide implementation of professional development through the RCAT program.
- California is standards-based (at the state level) both for curriculum and assessment.
- Traditionally has been a Special Education initiative, but CDE would like to implement RTI through General Education.

Current RTI Initiatives

- Drafting a guidance document for the use of RTI in LD identification.
 - Online writing group
- Developing a scale-up model for RTI ~RCAT Grants:
 - Using existing General Education program improvement process (RCAT – Riverside County Achievement Team) to provide RTI training
 - 8 regional teams received grants to take RCAT training “infused” with RTI
 - Each team will provide this training to staff at 3 sites
 - Implementation will be monitored over the next 3 years (student outcomes, outcomes for students with disabilities, graduation rates, dropout rates, parent participation, etc.)
- Implementation of online webinars, discussions, question & answer sessions focused on components of RTI.

Looking Forward

- Review & rollout guidance document through General and Special Education
- CDE's goals for statewide RTI implementation:
 - Expand stakeholders group to increase consistency and buy-in,
 - Discuss next steps, starting with learning about what other states are doing to achieve effective systemic change and RTI implementation,
 - Develop a strategic plan to include necessary TA and training on elements including behavior, academics, and cultural and linguistic competence,
 - Develop a plan to leverage resources: human, fiscal, TA from the federal RTI TA Center, Regional Equity Network Center, in collaboration with state organizations, including parents (in a model of Shared leadership), and
 - Identify model sites and best practices.
