Reading

Teaching All Students to Read in Elementary School: A Guide for Principals has just been released by the Center on Instruction. This "quick start" guide for elementary school-level instructional leaders is based on scientific research on reading and reding instruction as well as on studies of successful schools and interviews with successful principals. It includes critical elements of an effective reading program in elementary school, critical tasks for principals as literacy leaders, and special considerations for reading instruction after third grade. Improving Literacy Instruction in Middle and High Schools: A Guide for Principals has just been released by the Center on Instruction. Answers to Your Questions.... in Reading

Q: (From a Regional Comprehensive Center) Do you know of any research to support heterogeneous vs. homogeneous grouping for reading centers?

A: We don't know of any formal research on this subject; however, the "best practice" recommendation points out homogeneous grouping is typically recommended for activities involved phonemic awareness, phonics, and fluency, but heterogeneous groupings may work as well or better for vocabulary and comprehension activities.

A good resource is a chapter called *Grouping for Instruction* in the book "Differentiated Instruction: Grouping for Success" by Vickie Gibson and Jan Hasbrouck. Chapter 3 of this book discusses the criteria for picking which type of group:

- the skill taught or assessed;
- changes in student performance as data indicates that may necessitate regrouping;
- type of activity used; and
- resources (time, equipment, personnel).

It also lists some references within the text of the chapter that identify best practices for grouping, explicit and systematic instruction, selecting curriculum, monitoring progress and evaluating achievement (Farrell, Hancock & Smart, 2002; Fuchs, et al, 1997; Gersten, Vaughn, Deschler & Schiller, 1997; Hall, 2004; Moody, Vaughn & Schumm 1997; Vaughn, Hughes, Moody & Elbaum, 1998; Tomlinson & Eidson, 2003; Tyner, 2004).
